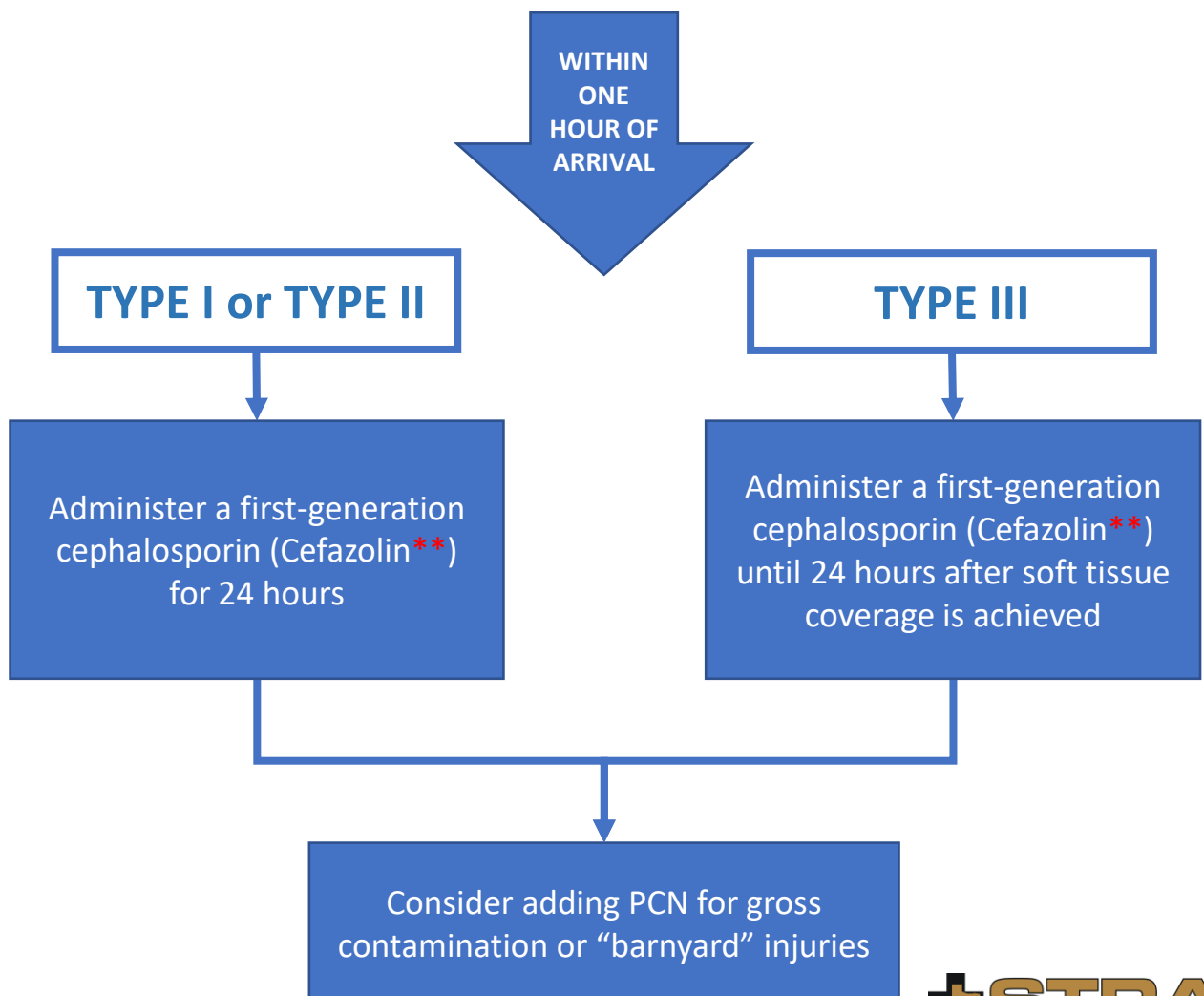


STRAC Regional Clinical Practice Guidelines for the Management & Treatment of Open Extremity and/or Pelvic Fractures

February 2022

PATIENT PRESENTS WITH ANY OPEN FRACTURE OF THE EXTREMITIES AND/OR PELVIS WITH THE FOLLOWING GUSTILO CLASSIFICATION:

- TYPE I:** Open fracture with skin wound <1cm in length and is clean
- TYPE II:** Open fracture with a laceration >1cm in length without extensive soft tissue damage, flaps, or avulsion
- TYPE III:** Open segmental fracture with >10cm wound with extensive soft tissue injury or a traumatic amputation (special categories in Type III include gunshot fractures and open fractures caused by farm injuries)
 - TYPE IIIA:** Adequate soft tissue coverage
 - TYPE IIIB:** Significant soft tissue loss with exposed bone that requires soft tissue transfer to achieve coverage
 - TYPE IIIC:** Associated vascular injury that requires repair for limb preservation



**Administer Clindamycin if allergy to Cefazolin
