Background: AABB Interorganizational Task Force on Domestic Disasters and Acts of Terrorism (Disaster Task Force)


Established in January 2002

Purpose:

- 1) Ensure that blood collection efforts resulting from domestic disasters and acts of terrorism are managed properly
- 2) Deliver clear and consistent messages to the public regarding the status of America's blood supply
- 3) Identify infrastructure challenges and coordinate transport of blood



Composition of Task Force



- AABB: Designated coordinating body for Task Force
- Critical Event Assessment Group (CEAG):
 - · America's Blood Centers
 - · American Red Cross
 - · Blood Centers of America
 - · Liaison: Armed Services Blood Program
 - Liaison: HHS Office of Assistant Secretary for Health (OASH)
- Additional Members of Task Force:
 - American Hospital Association
 - College of American Pathologists
 - AdvaMed
 - National Marrow Donor Program
 - Plasma Protein Therapeutics Association
 - Liaison: Centers for Disease Control and Prevention
 - · Liaison: Food and Drug Administration.



Emergency Chain of Events

- AABB immediately convenes a meeting of the CEAG to assess impact.
- Local blood centers:
 - > Estimate blood needs.
 - ➤ Assess local area for risk and local blood supply
 - ➤ Identify any infrastructure-related issues.
 - ➤ Plan for any facility closure.
 - ➤ Communicate that information to the Task Force.



Emergency Chain of Events, cont.

- CEAG determines activation need, strategy and coordinates efforts:
 - Monitor emergency information for radiation dispersal areas and evacuations.
 - ➤ Identify priorities and determine next steps.
 - Assist with transporting and coordinating needed blood products and supplies to the affected area.
 - ➤ Construct message to the blood community and donors.
 - Coordinate broad public message in conjunction with HHS.
- AABB communicates CEAG recommendations to other members of the Task Force
 and remains in an activated status until there are no unmet needs or current needs can
 be resolved through regular channels.
